The Libbie A. Cass Scholarship Fund

The goal of this fund is to provide some financial support to Springfield residents who are furthering their education.

1. Applicants must be continuing on to a program of higher education, such as: college, graduate school, vocational school, training or apprentice programs.
2. Applicants must be a resident of Springfield, NH.
3. Applicants must provide all necessary paper work on time.
4. Trustees will review each applicant and approve applicants at the May or June meeting.
5. Amount of scholarship depends on funds available and may vary from year to year.
6. Checks will be awarded in June.
7. Should a student not attend a program of higher education, trustees expect the scholarship gift to be returned to the library.
8. Trustees will decide how much each recipient gets. General policy is to divide equally, but preference may be given to recipients who used the library extensively or volunteered there. Other factors which trustees deem relevant may be considered.
